

## Torah Portíon Bo - Come January 28, 2023 Exodus 10:1-13:6; Jeremíah 46:13-28; John 19:31-37

- \*Exodus 10:1-2 And the Lord said to Moses, Go in to Pharaoh: for I have hardened his heart, and the heart of his servants, that I might show these my signs before him: And that you may tell in the ears of your son, and of your son's son, what things I have wrought in Egypt, and my signs which I have done among them; that you may know that I am the Lord.
- \*Exodus 9:26 Only in the land of Goshen, where the people of Israel were, was there no hail.
- \*Exodus 5:2 But Pharaoh said, Who is the LORD, that I should obey his voice and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD, and moreover, I will not let Israel go.
- \*Exodus 10:7 Then Moses turned and left Pharaoh. Pharaoh's officials said to him, "How long will this man be a snare to us? Let the people go, so that they may worship the LORD their God. Do you not yet realize that Egypt is ruined?"
- \*Exodus 10:1 Then the LORD said to Moses, "Go to Pharaoh, for I have <u>hardened</u> <u>his heart and the hearts of his officials</u> so that I may perform these signs of mine among them.
- \*Exodus 10:3-6 So Moses and Aaron came into Pharaoh and said to him, "Thus says the Lord God of the Hebrews: 'How long will you refuse yourself before Me? Let My people go, that they may serve Me. Or else, if you refuse to let My people go, behold, tomorrow I will bring locusts into your territory. And they shall cover the face of the earth, so that no one will be able to see the earth; and they shall eat the residue of what is left, which remains to you from the hail, and they shall eat every tree which grows up for you out of the field. They shall fill your houses, the houses of all your servants, and the houses of all the Egyptians—which neither your fathers nor your fathers' fathers have seen, since the day that they were on the earth to this day.' "And he turned and went out from Pharaoh.

- \*Exodus 10:8-9 So Moses and Aaron were brought back to Pharaoh, and he said to them, Go, worship the Lord your God! Who are the ones to go? Moses replied, We will all go, young and old; we will go with our sons and daughters our flocks and herds; for we must observe the Lord's festival.
- \*Exodus 10:14-15 Locusts invaded all the land of Egypt and settled within all the territory of Egypt in a thick mass; never before had there been so many, nor will there ever be so many again. They hid all the land from view, and the land was darkened; and they ate up all the grasses of the field and all the fruit of the trees which the hail had left, so that nothing green was left of tree or grass of the field, in all the land of Egypt.
- \*Exodus 10:16-17 Pharaoh hurriedly summoned Moses and Aaron and said, I stand guilty before the Lord your God and before you. Forgive my offense just this once, and plead with the Lord your God that he but remove this death from me.
- \*Exodus 10:21-22 Then the Lord said to Moses, Hold out your arm toward the sky that there may be darkness upon the land of Egypt, a darkness that can be touched. Moses held out his arm toward the sky and thick darkness descended upon all the land of Egypt for three days. People could not see one another, and for three days no one could get up from where he was; where he was;
- \*Exodus 10:23 People could not see one another, and for three days no one could get up from where he was; but all the Israelites enjoyed light in their dwellings.
- \*Exodus 10:24-25 Pharaoh summoned Moses and said, Go, worship the Lord! Only your flocks and your herds shall be left behind; even your children may go with you. But Moses said, You, yourself must provide us with sacrifices and burnt offerings to offer up to the Lord our God;
- \*Exodus 10:28-29 Pharaoh said to him, Be gone from me! <u>Take care not to see</u> me again, for the moment you look upon my face you shall die. And Moses replied, You have spoken rightly. <u>I shall not see your face again!</u>
- \*Exodus 11: 1-2 Then the LORD said to Moses, "I will bring upon Pharaoh and Egypt one more plague. After that, he will allow you to leave this place. And when he lets you go, he will drive you out completely. Now announce to the people that men and women alike should ask their neighbors for articles of silver and gold." And

the LORD gave the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians. Moreover, Moses himself was highly regarded in Egypt by Pharaoh's officials and by the people....

- \*Exodus 11:4-5 Moses said, Thus says the Lord: Toward midnight I will go forth among the Egyptians, and every first-born in the land of Egypt shall die, from the first-born of Pharaoh who sits on his throne to the first born of the slave girl who is behind the millstones; and all the first-born of the cattle.
- \*Exodus 12:2 This month shall mark for you the <u>beginning of the months</u>; it shall <u>be the first of the month of the year for you</u>.
- \*Exodus 12:3&5 Speak to the whole community of Israel and say that on the tenth of this month each of these shall take a lamb to a family, a lamb to a household...... Your lamb shall be without blemish, a yearling male; you may take it from the sheep or from the goats.
- I Peter 1:18-19 ...For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from the empty way of life you inherited from your forefathers, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or spot.
- \*Exodus 12:6-8 You shall keep watch over it until the fourteenth day of this month; and all the assembled congregation of the Israelites shall <u>slaughter it at twilight</u>.
- \*Exodus 12:39 And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough that they had brought out of Egypt, for it was not leavened, because they were thrust out of Egypt and could not wait, nor had they prepared any provisions for themselves.
- \*Exodus 12:11 In this manner you shall eat it (referring to the pesach lamb): with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the LORD's Passover.
- \*Song of Songs 8:14 <u>Make haste</u>, hipping my beloved, and be like a gazelle or a young stag on the mountains of spices.

  ANOTHER VERSION SAYS:
- \*Song of Songs 8:14 <u>Come away</u>, my beloved, and be like a gazelle or a young stag on the mountains of spices.

- \*Isaiah 52:12 For you shall not go out in haste, בְּחָפְּזוֹלְ and you shall not go in flight, for the LORD will go before you, and the God of Israel will be your rear guard.
- \*Exodus 14:19 And the angel of God, who had gone before the camp of Israel, withdrew and went behind them. The pillar of cloud also moved from before them and stood behind them,
- \*Exodus 14:20 so that it came between the camps of Egypt and Israel. The <u>cloud</u> was there in the darkness, but <u>it lit up the night</u>. So all night long neither camp went near the other.
- \*Deuteronomy 16:3 Do not eat it with bread made with yeast, but for seven days eat unleavened bread, the bread of affliction, because you <u>left Egypt in haste</u>.

  11977—so that all the days of your life you may remember the time of your departure from Egypt.
- II Peter 3:10-12a But the day of the Lord will <u>come like a thief</u>. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare. Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and <u>speed its coming</u>.
- \*Proverbs 6:15 Therefore his calamity will come suddenly; Instantly he will be broken and there will be no healing.
- \*Isaiah 48:3 I declared the former things long ago And they went forth from My mouth, and I proclaimed them. Suddenly I acted, and they came to pass.
- \*Luke 21:34 Be on guard, so that your hearts will not be weighted down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of life, and that day will not come on you suddenly like a trap;
- \*John 16:33 I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.

\*Isaiah 25:9 And it shall be said in that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, and he will save us: this is the LORD; we have waited for him, we will be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

\*Revelation 22:20 He who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming quickly." Amen. Even so, come, Lord Jesus!
